## **Order of Worship**

Preparing our Hearts: If you arrive a little early, prepare your heart for worship by reading and thinking about this text:

- Titus 3:4-6 (on screen)

Call to Worship:

- God calls us to worship
  - The earth is the LORD's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein,  
**for he has founded it upon the seas and established it upon the rivers.**  
Who shall ascend the hill of the LORD? And who shall stand in his holy place?  
**He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false and does not swear deceitfully.** (Psalm 24:1-4)
- We humbly respond with praise
  - “Behold Our God”

Gospel Assurance:

- Our need for Jesus
  - Psalm 130
- God's grace
  - “God Made Low”
  - “Silent Night”

What we Believe: As a church we want to affirm our unity in what we believe.

- “We Believe”

Prayer: We bring our requests to the Lord through Jesus Christ.

Church Life/Greeting: In Christ, we live and fellowship together as believers. We take time to learn what is going on in our church, and to greet one another as we worship.

Prayer for Understanding: We pray that God will open our hearts and minds to the preaching of His Word.

Sermon:

- 1 Corinthians 6:1-11

Lord's Supper: In taking communion together, we remember the death of Christ as we proclaim it to one another as we consume the elements.

- “Rock Of Ages”

Praise to God (Doxology): We end our time of worship together as we resound in praises together.

- “Your Name”

God Blesses: We go into the world this week with God's blessings as He enables us to serve Him.

- 1 Peter 5:10-11
