## **Order of Worship**

Preparing our Hearts: If you arrive a little early, prepare your heart for worship by reading and thinking about this text:

- *But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.* (Phil. 3:20-21 ESV)

Call to Worship:

- God calls us to worship
  - Psalm 34:1-3
- We humbly respond with praise
  - “Made Me Glad”
  - “Hosanna”

Gospel Assurance:

- Our need for Jesus
  - “O Great God”
- God’s grace
  - Psalm 103:8-14
  - “Come Praise And Glorify”

What we Believe: As a church we want to affirm our unity in what we believe.

- *We believe that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.*  
(Based on Rom. 8:38-39)

Prayer: We bring our requests to the Lord through Jesus Christ.

Church Life/Greeting: In Christ, we live and fellowship together as believers. We take time to learn what is going on in our church, and to greet one another as we worship.

Prayer for Understanding: We pray that God will open our hearts and minds to the preaching of His Word.

Sermon:

- 1 Corinthians 15:35-58

Lord's Supper: In taking communion together, we remember the death of Christ as we proclaim it to one another as we consume the elements.

- “My Life Is An Offering”

Praise to God (Doxology): We end our time of worship together as we resound in praises together.

- “10,000 Reasons (Bless The Lord)”

God Blesses: We go into the world this week with God's blessings as He enables us to serve Him.

- 1 Timothy 1:17
