<u>Preparing our Hearts:</u> If you arrive a little early, prepare your heart for worship by reading and thinking about this text:

• For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. (Rom. 5:10 ESV)

Call to Worship:

- God calls us to worship
 - To you I lift up my eyes, O you who are enthroned in the heavens! Behold, as the eyes of servants look to the hand of their master, as the eyes of a maidservant to the hand of her mistress, so our eyes look to the LORD our God, till he has mercy upon us. (Ps. 123:1-2 ESV)
- We humbly respond with praise
 - "God of Wonders"
 - o "Your Name"

Gospel Assurance:

- Our need for Jesus
 - Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD!
 - O Lord, hear my voice!

Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my pleas for mercy! If you, O LORD, should mark iniquities, O Lord, who could stand?

But with you there is forgiveness, that you may be feared. I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning. O Israel, hope in the LORD!

For with the LORD there is steadfast love, and with him is plentiful redemption. And he will redeem Israel from all his iniquities. (Ps. 130 ESV)

- God's grace
 - o "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Cor. 15:55-57 ESV)
 - o "Redeemed, Restored, Forgiven"
