Order of Worship December 23, 2018

<u>Preparing Our Hearts:</u> If you arrive a little early, prepare your heart for worship by reading and thinking about this text:

 Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation. (Ps. 42:5 ESV)

Call to Worship:

- God calls us to worship
 - Praise the LORD! Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens! Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his excellent greatness! Praise him with trumpet sound; praise him with lute and harp! Praise him with tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe! Praise him with sounding cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that has breath praise the LORD! Praise the LORD! (Ps. 150:1-6 ESV)

Gospel Assurance:

- Our need for Jesus
 - If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. (1 Cor. 13:1-3 ESV)

Small Group Discussion Questions

- 1. In this week's text, we noticed how Jesus prayed just prior to drinking "this cup" that was before him (verses 35-36). Sometimes it helps us understand these types of metaphors better when we see how they were used in the Old Testament. Read Isaiah 51:17 and Jeremiah 25:15-18. What, exactly, do you think Jesus was referring to when he asked for "this cup" to be removed? What does the text teach you about Jesus' commitment to submit to and accept the Father's will?
- 2. What does the example of Jesus' vigilance and prayer teach you about facing intense trials with faithfulness to God? Why would Jesus tell the three disciples to watch and pray that they not enter into temptation (verse 38)? What connection do you see between being spiritually watchful, praying, and being faithful to the Lord when facing trials?
- 3. How does today's text encourage you in your own prayer life? How does Jesus' willingness to drink "this cup" on your behalf affect you?
