<u>Preparing Our Hearts:</u> If you arrive a little early, prepare your heart for worship by reading and thinking about this text:

• I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. (Gal. 2:20 ESV)

Call to Worship:

- God calls us to worship
 - o In the LORD I take refuge; how can you say to my soul, "Flee like a bird to your mountain, for behold, the wicked bend the bow; they have fitted their arrow to the string to shoot in the dark at the upright in heart; if the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" The LORD is in his holy temple; the LORD's throne is in heaven; his eyes see, his eyelids test the children of man. (Ps. 11:1-4 ESV)
- We humbly respond with praise
 - "How Great Thou Art"
 - o "Here I Am To Worship"

Gospel Assurance:

- Our need for Jesus
 - You were taught to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires,

and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.

Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor,

for we are members one of another. (Eph. 4:22-25 ESV)

- God's grace
 - For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. (Jn. 3:16-17 ESV)

What We Believe: As a church we want to affirm our unity in what we believe.
